March 24, 2024 | Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion



Dear Parish Ohana.

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord"

Today we begin the holiest week in the Christian Calendar known as Holy Week. As we celebrate Palm Sunday, our Lenten Pilgrimage takes a great dramatic turn. Jesus enters Jerusalem with his friends in high spirits, full of hope and the crowd is on his side as they welcome him with shouts of joy, "Hosanna in the highest, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord". This entrance is a very political one. At the time of Jesus, victorious generals with their armies returned home and entered the city in similar fashion as the crowds waved branches and shouted out their names.

No other Sunday in our liturgical calendar contains so much drama and tension as today. What begins with shouts of joy and the feeling of victory will quickly change as the same crowd a week later will shout, "Crucify him, crucify him!" His spectacular entrance into the city is also his entrance into his betrayal, denial, condemnation, suffering and death and ultimately his Resurrection. "He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he open not his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers..." (Is 53:7.)

We are part of both crowds, and as we witness and reflect on his suffering, we will also experience his Resurrection. We pray that as we enter deeper into this most sacred of weeks with Jesus, we will be drawn closer to him and each other. With arms opened wide on the cross, Jesus invites us to draw near to His Sacred Heart of love so that through him we shall find strength to be good stewards for his vineyard.



A Stewardship Moment

This weekend we participate in the proclamation of the passion and death of Jesus according to the Gospel of Mark. In the extended version of this weekend's Gospel reading, Jesus is Gethsemane, praying to his Father, in much emotional distress. He knows he can save himself. He can escape over the Mount of Olives in the dead of night and make his way safely into the Judean desert. Instead, Jesus chooses obedience to his Father and waits for his persecutors. As Saint Paul puts it in the second reading, Jesus is "obedient to the point of death." Jesus' obedience is a lesson for those who are good stewards of their life in Christ. Let us reflect on how we might be more obedient to the will of God instead of our own will.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST continued... PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS:

TWO PREPARATIONS: The Preparation of the gifts serves a twofold purpose. First the gifts of bread and wine are prepared for their consecration at the Eucharistic Prayer. Second, through the prayers during this time, the priest and the people are prepared to take part in the Eucharistic Prayer. The prayer said over the bread and the wine comes form the Jewish tradition of the Berakah Prayer ("Blessed are you, O Lord"), prayers that give thanks for the bread and wine that are still said as part of the Jewish Friday night Sabbath meal blessing. In this prayer, the priest gives thanks for the gifts of bread and wine, recalling that these gifts will soon become the Body and Blood of Christ.

Mixture of Water and Wine: The priest mixes a little bit of water into the wine. This gesture has a spiritual significance. The deacon says, "By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ (wine), who humbled himself to share in our humanity (water)." We pray that just as the water and wine become one, that we may also become one with Christ.

Priest and Washing of Hands: The priest washes his hands. While this originally served as a practical cleansing, the priest also prays silently a prayer for spiritual cleanliness, "Lord, wash away my iniquity; cleanse me from my sin."

Next Sunday we will look at the Eucharistic Prayer.

Life in the Spirit Seminars

In the 1960's Vatican II called for the renewal of the spiritual life of the Catholic people. In 1967, college students on a retreat received that New Pentecost, and developed a seminar to share how others could have the same encounter with the Holy Spirit. It is hoped that this Life in the Spirit seminar will be a tool for that spiritual revitalization and an answer to Pope John XXIII's prayer, "Renew in our day, O Lord, your wonders as in a new Pentecost." Since then, over 120,000,000 Catholics in 240 countries have taken some type of Life in the Spirit seminar and have discovered that the Holy Spirit is not an inaccessible, "ghostly" intelligence, but the very "breath" of our lives as followers of Jesus Christ.

The original Life in the Spirit seminar was used as an evangelistic tool in home, work, and social groups, and not primarily in church situations. But many do now use the seminar for church renewal in the parish or other church circumstances. The seminar is designed so that church members can "renew" their baptismal life in Jesus, which is sacramentally confirmed as young Catholic adults, recommit to the Lord, and experience a fuller "life in the Spirit." The seminar is usually a weekly, seven-week course which covers talks, testimonies and small group sharing on God's Love; Salvation; New Life; Receiving God's Gifts; Baptism in the Holy Spirit, Growth; and Transformation. As a people of God, we still have so much to learn about our ongoing immersion into God's life and Spirit. "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Romans 5:5)

"The Spirit prepares men and goes out to them with his grace to draw them to Christ. The Spirit manifests the risen Lord to them, recalls his word to them and opens their minds to the understanding of his Death and Resurrection. He makes present the mystery of Christ, supremely in the Eucharist, to reconcile them, to bring them into communion with God that they may 'bear much fruit." (John 15:8,16 and Catechism of the Catholic Church 737)
