
SAINT GEORGE CATHOLIC CHURCH May 21, 2023 | Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord



SUNDAY MASS READINGS

Christ has entered the Father's glory in order that He may be more perfectly with us. He was not taken far away from us, but merely from our sight; He is with us still. The Ascension of Christ reminds us of our destiny: we, too, are destined to enter into the Father's glory. Where Christ has gone we, His members, must surely follow. We are, even now, citizens of heaven. Let us live as such.

1st Reading: Acts 1: 1-11

In the Ascension, Jesus is taken into the cloud of God's glory. This same cloud showed God's presence in the tabernacle in the Exodus. The same cloud is found in the scene of the Transfiguration, when the glory of divinity shone through Christ's humanity.

2nd Reading: Ephesians 1: 17-23

Jesus is no longer limited to time and space on earth. In His glory, He is superior to every being in the universe. Jesus Christ is the fullness of the Father; the Church is the fullness of Christ: The Church is to Christ and Christ is to the Father.

Gospel: Matthew 28: 16-20

As Jesus ascends into heaven, He sends us to be His witnesses. He promises us that He will be with us until the end of time.

Happy Ascension Sunday! Mission accomplished!


Though Jesus would have wanted to do more with his physical presence here on earth, the mission he was sent to do had somewhat come to an end. At this time, he was returning back to his original glory and he promised his disciples: "*I am going to prepare a place for you.*" This only shows that although our lives may take different twists and turns, our destination is the same, union with God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

However, where Jesus' mission ends here on earth, a new journey begins for us: "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you..." With that, he disappeared as they looked dumbfounded, staring into the sky. The torch had been passed over to them to be witnesses and their lives would no longer be the same.

To be a witness of Jesus, is both a privilege and an obligation. This honor bestowed on us, can for the most part be scary because many times we feel unworthy. It is the Lord who makes us worthy though when we turn to him. This shows that it was Jesus' intent to pass on the torch to be kept burning. Jesus, being realistic, knew very well that the work and mission he was handing over would be challenging and difficult at times, leading some to want to give up or quit. It is for this reason that he promised them the gift of the Holy Spirit to help them in this urgent and important mission: *"I am with you always, until the end of the age."* Next Sunday at Pentecost, we will see how we are never alone, in health and sickness, in poverty and in riches, laboring as stewards in the vineyard of the Lord.

Their presentations are geared towards the love of the Sacraments, focusing on the **Eucharistic Revival** and encouraging people to not only be Disciples of JESUS CHRIST but to also lead others to HIM.

Movement organizer, **Dcn. Steve Greco**, is the Director of Evangelization and Faith Formation at the Diocese of Orange, and president of Spirit Filled Hearts Ministry, which engages in evangelization and support of the foreign missions.

Barbara Heil is a longtime protestant minister convert with experience ministering to the poor, in children's camps and inner-city missions. Heil discovered late in life that she had been baptized as a child in the Catholic Church. She received the Rite of Confirmation in 2013 and has since ministered around the world.

Deacon Larry Oney of the Archdiocese of New Orleans and his wife Andi Oney. Deacon Oney is the founder and president of Hope and Purpose Ministries in Louisiana, which he created in part to provide mentorship through the creation and distribution of Catholic materials in all forms of media.

Andi Oney, international evangelist and author, previously served in education for 12 years. In 2013 her life changed while attending an International Prophetic Consultation gathering of leaders in Bethlehem, Israel. While in Israel, she experienced a dramatic conversion as she prayed in the Upper Room in Jerusalem, believed to be the site of the Last Supper and Pentecost.

Evangelist Kathleen Beckman, a popular presenter on topics including the spiritual life, Eucharistic life, healing and deliverance ministry,

Divine Mercy, Mary, and the spirituality of Blessed Conchita Cabrera. She is author of four best-selling books, "Praying for Priests," "God's Healing Mercy," "When Women Pray" and "A Family Guide to Spiritual Warfare". For twenty-five years, and in thirteen countries, through Catholic radio and television, writing and speaking, she has served in the Church's ministry of evangelization.

Bishop Larry Silva will celebrate Mass. Dominic Olaso (Head of the Diocesan Evangelization TaskForce) will emcee and lead the Praise & Worship.
