SUNDAY MASS READINGS

It is easy to gossip; it is hard to take a person aside privately and to offer help for his problems. It is easy to be a busy-body; it is hard to have the humility to seek the correction of another person in confidence while preserving his dignity. Today's Mass challenges us to have the humility to offer genuine love to our neighbor who sins.

1st Reading: Ezekiel 33: 7-9

Even in the Old Testament, God commanded His people to seek the correction of their brother. If we see our brother doing wrong and fail to help him to avoid his wrongdoing, we are guilty of his sin.

2nd Reading: Romans 13: 8-10

One sentence sums up all the commandments of God: Love your neighbor as yourself. True love of neighbor demands that we offer fraternal correction in a spirit of gentleness and humility. Love is never condescending or puffed up; love never seeks to expose the faults of others to ridicule. Love seeks only the conversion of a person to the will of God.

Gospel: Matthew 18: 15-20

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us a strict order for fraternal correction. We must first offer correction privately. Faults of others can be made public only if all else fails. Let us pray for the grace to persevere the order that Christ gives us.

REMINDER

Dear Parish Ohana,

This Sunday we are reminded about our communality: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." To belong to the Church is to belong to a community of brothers and sisters in Christ. This means that being a Christian is not a private, purely personal affair, although that is the way some people seem to behave. When God asked Cain, "Where is your brother?" Cain answered, "Am I my brother's keeper?" (Gen. 4:9).

The teaching of the Gospel tells us that in every Christian Community, divisions will inevitably happen. We are communities of sinners trying to be saints and there are many pitfalls on the way. It is easy to think that being a Catholic means being concerned with the relationship between God and me that my duty is to "save my soul". But, in fact, the only way to "save my soul" is by becoming a truly loving and caring person as part of a loving and caring community of people united in Christ. And sometimes that caring may involve bringing the brother/sister face to face with the loving demands of the Gospel. We do not help each other by turning a blind eye to behavior which is clearly unchristian.

As a community we have a responsibility for each other's wellbeing. We do not further the witness of a loving community when we, in false "charity", ignore social problems such as drug-taking, alcoholism, compulsive gambling, violence in the home, discrimination against the physically and mentally handicapped, racial exploitation and the like in a parish community. It is not enough just to deal with these things in the privacy of "Confession" for, ultimately, reconciliation must be at the community level. And, as such, this is the responsibility of the community exercising its calling as the Body of Christ.

It is like, in Saint Paul's vocabulary, a kind of "debt" that we can never "pay-in full." But we begin to repay by following the direction of one of the most familiar statements in the Bible: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Good stewards realize that God does not call them just to love those who are easy to love, but to love the unloved and the hard-to-love people in this world as well. This week, remind yourself: "I am put here as an ambassador of God's love."




Question of the Week

2. Belief in the Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist is waning among professed Catholics, and it is up to us believers to spread the truth to all.
3. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery.
4. Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than our problems and struggles. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world.
5. In a world where not many people know Jesus intimately, the revival is meant to show everyone what wonders the True Presence of Jesus can do to heal the soul.
6. Our world is hurting and we all need healing, because many of us are separated from the very source of our strength.
7. Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith: his Real Presence in the Eucharist.
8. It takes time to kindle a living, loving relationship—and a relationship with Jesus Christ is no exception.
9. Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire your response as you fan the flames of revival in our parish!
10. Jesus needs each one of us to be his hands and feet throughout this Eucharistic Revival.

St. George Parish Maintenance and Repair Report Completed Projects for July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023

CHURCH

- Installed four air conditioning units in the church.
- Installed electrical lines for the air conditioning.
- Replaced screens with wood on the open space above the Stations of the Cross.
- Changed 16 chandelier bulbs to LED bulbs.
- Installed wireless microphones at the lectern and ambo.
- Coated and painted the damaged eaves of the church roof.
- Installed window blinds in the sacristy.

PARISH OFFICE

- Upgraded telephone lines and purchased telephones.
- Upgraded computer units and systems.
- Installed computer and Wi-Fi lines.
- Rewired electrical lines.
- Installed new electrical panel board.
- Upgraded electrical switches and sockets.
- Insulated exposed electrical wires.
- Removed damaged electrical lines.
- Installed window blinds in the meeting room.
- Installed light fixtures.
- Installed electrical switches and sockets.

PARISH HALL

- Painted the interior wall.
- Repaired the ceiling insulation.

RECTORY

- Expanded first floor living room.
- Purchased a dining room table and chairs.
- Replaced floor carpet to wood tiles.
- Installed window blinds.
- Upgraded electrical switches and sockets on the first floor.
- Conducted trouble shooting of electrical system.
- Installed light fixtures.
- Purchased a refrigerator and electric stove.
- Installed a ceiling beam to reinforce the structure.


