SAINT GEORGE CATHOLIC CHURCH



On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with another gift-forgiveness. In todav's Gospel, this connection is made in the final verses.

Jesus invites them to experience his resurrected body with their senses, to look and to touch. The figure before them is flesh and bone, still bearing the marks of crucifixion. Although the disciples cannot forget his suffering and death, peace begins to take root in their hearts, as their fears turn to joy and amazement.

Luke's report of the Last Supper and the meals that Jesus shared after his Resurrection unveil for us the significance of the Eucharist. Having shared a meal with his disciples, Jesus now uncovers for them the significance of what was written about him in the Scriptures. So, too, our celebration of the Mass is an encounter with Jesus, through the Word and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. As Jesus commissions his disciples to be witnesses to what Scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us.



APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

Who are the most vulnerable and most easily influenced people in society? A good guess would be the young, the youth. Yet they are not always under the protective umbrella of kind and loving people. As adults, especially as parenting adults and teaching adults, it is the duty and moral obligation of all to keep the dignity, the health and welfare of these innocents intact. In this light, St. George's Religious Education's intent is to protect and keep its youth safe in mind, body and spirit.

To prepare for their work with youth, Catechists and all who will interact with youth, go through Safe Environment training and certification through a program called VIRTUS which also includes background screening.

Safe environment lessons, offered by the Diocese of Honolulu called Circles of Care are used in classrooms as one means of providing information to youth for good decision making and self protection should danger arise. Conversations about safety do not stop when the lesson is over. They continue as long as youth need to be supported, uplifted and safe.

YOUTH IN EUCHARISTIC ACTION

On the first Sunday of every month, Religious Education youth spend time in Eucharistic Adoration praying, listening to music and learning to use quiet time for meditation. This kind of "talking" with Jesus, for young people, is new and awkward at first. But as times progresses so do they. This behavior that has to be learned then cultivated and refined is one way to allow the youth to feel comfortable within themselves as they build their kind of relationship with Jesus.

In the quiet moments of Adoration, some youth with eyes closed look serene and calm. Some kneel while others sit but all are trying their best to make their witness of Jesus' presence one of deep reverence. Parishioners who happen to be in church at the same time, fall into the posture of devotion that they know well. All are Blessed!

THE COMMUNION RITE (Part 1):

After the Eucharistic Prayer is completed, all stand. Standing is a sign of respect and honor. The next series of prayers and actions are designed as one final preparation before we receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Lord's Prayer: Praying the Our Father together as a community has been mandated in public prayer from the earliest centuries of the church. Pope St. Gregory the Great called this prayer the perfect prayer to say over the Lord's Body and Blood, because it asks for the "Daily Bread" of the Eucharist as well as asking for forgiveness of sins and forgiveness of others. Towards the end of the prayer, the priest adds an extended response to the phrase "deliver us from evil" called an embolism. In the embolism, the priest explicitly asks for peace and forgiveness of sins as we prepare to receive the Eucharist. At the end of this embolism, the people respond "For the kingdom, and the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever."

Rite of Peace: The Rite of Peace recalls Christ's gift of peace at the Last Supper (see John 14:27) and our continued prayer for peace and forgiveness of sins. To this prayer we respond "Amen." The priest says to all "The peace of the Lord be with you always," to which we respond, "And with your spirit." The priest or deacon then invites us to extend to one another a sign of Christ's peace.

The peace that we extend to one another is not an individual wish, but the peace of Jesus Christ. It symbolizes our reconciliation with one another before we come forward to receive Communion (see Matthew 5:24). If you're uncomfortable extending a hand, you can still participate in the sign of peace by looking people in the eye while saying "Peace be with you."
