April 30, 2023 | Fourth Sunday of Easter



SUNDAY MASS READINGS

Today is often called "Good Shepherd Sunday." In today's Mass Christ is called the Good Shepherd, the Lamb of God, and the gate of the sheepfold. All these expressions tell of the mystery of Jesus who laid down His life for us. This is the same Jesus who leads us to eternal joy. Let us find the entire meaning of our lives only in Him.

First Reading: Acts 2: 14a, 36-41

Today's first reading is a continuation of that of last Sunday. The reading concludes the first sermon of Peter on Pentecost. At the end of this sermon Peter invites all to share in the mercy and forgiveness of God which comes through Jesus Christ.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2: 20b-25

The second reading shows Jesus as the Suffering Servant of the Lord — one who takes to himself all of the sorrows and griefs of men and who heals them by his suffering. In the second part of the reading, the metaphors are changed. We are the straying sheep who must return to Christ, the shepherd of our souls, who will lead us to life and safety.

Gospel: John 10: 1-10

In today's Gospel, Jesus calls Himself the "gate" of the sheepfold. The scene of the Gospel is after His cure of a blind man. The Pharisees were the leaders, the shepherds of Israel; yet they thought the blind man was lying, that he must be a sinner and that Jesus was a blasphemer because He cured the blind man on the Sabbath. In reply to the pettiness of the Pharisees, Jesus says that the real shepherds — the real leaders of the people — must come in through Him. He is the door, the gate. Many kinds of people and sheep can be found in the fold, but unless they come through Him, they are usurpers, thieves and marauders.

Dear Parish Ohana,

This Sunday is commonly known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" or "Vocations Sunday", a day when the Church prays especially for new shepherds and pastors to lead the Christian communities. The image of God as the shepherd of his people has a long tradition. The shepherd of the biblical times had a much more intimate relationship with his flock. He would bring them out to pasture each day and spend all his time with them. In the evening he would bring them back to the enclosure where they would be safe from preying animals. He knew each one individually and would notice immediately if even one was missing.

Today being Vocations Sunday, it is obvious that our Church than ever before, is in great need of good shepherds, totally committed to the Way of Jesus to lead people through the many turbulent times and storms. We are asked to pray especially that the Church will be graced with good shepherds and pastors. Let us pray for all priests and also for seminarians, all those contemplating a calling to the priesthood, religious life and deaconate.

With the above in view, we often tend to narrow the term "vocation" to those who feel called to such ministries, as when say: "There are very few 'vocations' in our diocese." Yet it needs to be emphasized strongly that every single baptized person has a 'vocation'. Everyone is called by God to play a specific role in the Christian and the wider community. Unless we see that 'vocation' is something that we are all called to, it is not likely that there will be enough people to meet the service needs of our Christian communities. Our parishes can only grow and thrive when every member contributes to the well-being of the whole. When all give, all receive in abundance, the abundance that Jesus speaks about in today's Gospel. May we all be stewards willing to respond to our calling and to give of ourselves to the Lord.

How can I be that gate, in imitation of Jesus? How do I protect others from danger or trauma and how do I comfort those who are lost or in pain?






Readings for next Sunday, May 7, 2023


