SUNDAY MASS READINGS

Fifty days after Easter, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles. They were changed from timid men into bold witnesses of Christ. The Church was born! The Holy Spirit guides the Church so that she teaches the truth of Christ; the Holy Spirit empowers the Church to sanctify people through sacred scriptures. Let us rejoice in the Holy Spirit and his gift.

1st Reading: Acts 2: 1-11

Quakes, fire and wind were signs of God's presence and accompanied the descent of the Holy Spirit. God himself came to visit his people, to live in their hearts, be their strength and to unite them in his truth and love.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12: 3b-7, 12-13

The Holy Spirit is the soul of the Church. Just as our human soul unifies the various cells and organs of our bodies, so the Holy Spirit gives unity to all the different members of Christ and enables all to use their talents for his glory. As the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the Church.

Gospel: John 20: 19-23

The peace which Christ gives is the blessed harmony and perfection of the kingdom of God which we share in this life. Through the Holy Spirit, Christ has reconciled us to God and to each other. We enjoy his peace even in this world.

Dear Parish Ohana,

Happy Birthday Church! Fifty days after Easter, today we celebrate the birthday of the Church, known as Pentecost. The Word "Pentecost" is derived from the Greek word "pentekoste" meaning "fiftieth day." Pentecost Sunday is a Christian feast with a Jewish origin in the Old Testament known as the "festival of weeks" (Shavuot) (Ex. 34:22). Since Shavuot is celebrated 50 days after the "pesach" (Passover or Christian Easter) in thanksgiving to God for the reception of the Torah, Hellenistic Jews gave it a Greek name pentekoste and that was the major reason why the Jews gathered in the first reading. In Christianity, we celebrate Pentecost, commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. It is also the tenth day after the Ascension.

Sometimes Pentecost seems like a minor event as it brings a close to the liturgical season of Easter. But consider that in the weeks following Christ's death and resurrection, many of his followers were undoubtedly still processing the incredible events they had witnessed and were probably wondering what God wanted them to do now that Jesus had carried out his mission. In reality it is a key moment in the history of the Christian faith. God empowered his disciples to be understood in many different languages. You might be thinking, "That's all very interesting, but why is Pentecost important?" It is important because it infused the small community of Jesus-followers with the core mission that would define the Christian church ever after - to share the message of Jesus Christ with the entire world.

We too are sent as Pentecostal people on the same mission to bring God's love to the world as we say: "Lord send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth." The world needs it perhaps more today.
