SUNDAY MASS READINGS

Jesus is going away, but will come to us in a more perfect way. He returns to the glory of the Father in order that He may send us the Paraclete, the Spirit of the Truth. The word "paraclete" means "defense attorney." If we love Christ and keep His commands, the Holy Spirit will be our defense against the ridicule and lies and persecutions of this world. Let us be faithful to Christ and confident of the presence of the Spirit.

1st Reading: Acts 8: 5-8, 14-17

The Church gradually spread from a narrow group of Jews until it encompassed half-Jews or Samaritans, and finally Gentiles. Today's first reading describes the conversion of the Samaritans. It tells us of the sacrament of Christian maturity by which the Samaritans receive the Holy Spirit through the laying on of the apostles' hands.

2nd Reading: 1 Peter 3: 15-18

No servant is greater than his master. If Jesus suffered, we also can expect ridicule, persecution and suffering. But God will give us His Holy Spirit to strengthen us in every crisis.

Gospel: John 14: 15-21

Jesus returns to the Father to prepare a place for us; He always pleads our case before the Father. But Jesus does not leave us orphans; He sends the Holy Spirit to be our "defense attorney" to plead our case before the world. With such power, who can be against us?

Dear Parish Ohana,

This Sunday's gospel reading opens with a simple, clear and direct statement from Jesus: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." The only way in which we can demonstrate our love for God and Jesus in a world filled with billions of people, all loved into life by God and all created in the image of God, is to love without reservation every person we encounter. Jesus himself proclaimed that the greatest commandment is to love. And that is a theme that runs all through John's Gospel and Letters. In fact he goes so far as to say that anyone who claims to love God and hates his or her neighbor is a liar: "... whoever does not love their brother or sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen" (1 John 4, 20).

Without love in their early years, children shrivel and die. Without love and affirmation in our adult years, we struggle with relationships, we fail to find self-acceptance and we don't find lasting, inner peace. Irrespective of our age and personal maturity, we all know how much we need to be loved, accepted, affirmed, encouraged and wanted. And occasionally we know the pain and loneliness that fill our lives when those experiences are missing. Jesus knew the confusion, disorientation and depression that awaited his disciples once he had left them and promised that he would not leave them to fend for themselves, to know the experience of being orphaned. So, he promised them the support of an Advocate who could not be any closer, the Spirit of God who would dwell with them. And that same Spirit is alive and dwells in each of us.

In more concrete ways, we show our solidarity with all God's creatures, especially the needy, by sharing our time, talents, and treasure.





For twenty-five years, and in thirteen countries, through Catholic radio and television, writing and speaking, she has served in the Church's ministry of evangelization.
